With the guidance provided by the County Health Department, I have decided to temporarily shut down the Visiting Unit until it is deemed safe to reopen again. I am also limiting the number of individuals entering the facility to staff and essential services only, these safety measures are effective Monday November 16, 2020.

I will do everything I can to help protect staff and inmates during this pandemic resurgence. As you can see, the numbers of COVID-19 positive cases are on the rise across the nation. Please ensure you all wear a mask if you are unable to social distance from other individuals.

Every new admit will continue to be tested upon intake to the facility and not placed in general population until COVID-19 free and cleared by the Department's Health Care Provider.

We will be providing voluntary temperature checks for staff upon entering the facility and will now begin more frequent cleaning and sanitizing in each building and inside the vehicles.

I urge each and everyone of you to seek medical attention from the Medical Unit staff, if you are not feeling well. Some of the signs and symptoms of COVID-19 are:

Most common symptoms include:

- \circ Fever
- Dry cough
- Tiredness

Less common symptoms:

- Aches and pains
- Sore throat
- Diarrhea
- Conjunctivitis
- Headache
- Loss of taste or smell
- Rash on skin, or discoloration of fingers or toes

As events unfold and new developments arise, I will advise you as soon as I receive that information.

Again, I strongly urge all of you to wear your mask, maintain social distancing whenever possible and to wash your hands frequently.
