Clerk item 55-20 is an ordinance supplemental to the annual appropriation ordinance in connection with the police department.

Item number 63-20 is a resolution to confirm the county executive's appointment of Jeanine Diehl to the position of executive director of the Office of Crime Victim Advocate.

And item 64-20 is a resolution to confirm the county executive's appointment of James E. Dzurenda to the position of sheriff of Nassau County.

May I have a motion. Moved by Legislator Kopel. Seconded by Legislator Rhoads. These items are before us. Good afternoon. We are going to talk about item 55-20.

MR. STEPHANOFF: Good afternoon.
Deputy Inspector Greg Stephanoff from the police department. Item 55 of ' 20 is a supplemental appropriation for the amount of $\$ 637,500$. This is our port security grant

program. This is a recurring grant we get for our port security program. There's a match of $\$ 212,500$. We are going to use this to buy a helicopter engine and it's going to be used when -- for FAA guidelines -- we have to repair or service the engine in the helicopter this engine will swap out into the helicopter and allow it not to go out of service.

LEGISLATOR FORD: Perfect. Any
debate or discussion? Thank you very much. On items actually 63-20 and 64-20, as they are appointments, we are going to vote to pass them through so that the full legislature will have an opportunity to discuss and to meet the candidates. So, no debate or discussion, right? No public comment? All those in favor of passing these items please signify by saying aye. Opposed? These item pass unanimously.

Now we're going to suspend the rules as we have some items on an addendum. Moved by Legislator Kopel and seconded by Legislator Ferretti. All those in favor of suspending the rules? Any opposed? Thank

Ordinance number 72-20, 73-20 and 74-20 are all ordinances supplemental to the annual appropriation ordinances in connection with the Traffic Safety Board.

May I have a motion to move these
items. Legislator Kopel and seconded by Legislator Rhoads. The items are now before us. Good afternoon Mr. Mistron.

MR. MISTRON: Christopher
Mistron, traffic safety, Stop DWI coordinator.

Item 72-20 is for the appropriation for the annual stop DWI program. The program itself is divided into several aspects, enforcement, prosecution, probation, education and public administration. The budget already has been to the state and approved in form for the distributions of these monies. It is a self-sufficient program in that fine monies are collected and by law are dedicated for use. Our fine monies for DWI as well as bail forfeitures are only allowed to be used for the DWI program and for DWI has maintained in
Public Safety 3-9-20
a separate account administered by the DWI coordinator.
$73-20$ is a grant budget for the handicapped surcharge. Handicap surcharge, as by law, all fines collected for handicap violations is divided between the Office of Handicapped and Physically Challenged as well as Traffic Safety for use for special programs within the two departments. In our particular case we utilize them for transportation, education, as well as we have included our child safety seat program for special needs children. We have a person that, although many people think $I$ know everything about it, is specialized in child safety seats for special needs. The money is used for that. Primarily the money is given under contract to the New York Coalition for Transportation Safety, who helps administer the program.

And then 74-20 is a special grant that we were able to receive from the Stop DWI Coordinators Association by way of National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and it

is for special holiday enforcement of DWI patrols. It's being split between our police department and six villages. The use of the money will be for instance for Saint Patrick's Day. For special high profile enforcements. We utilized both media releases as to the special programs. It will also be used for Memorial Day, July 4th and Labor Day.

LEGISLATOR FORD: Thank you very much. Any debate or discussion? Yes, Legislator Mule.

LEGISLATOR MULE: Hi. I do have a question. What are the six villages?

MR. MISTRON: I'll have to go by memory. It is the city of Glen Cove. It is Long Beach. It is Garden City. It is -- can I email that to you? Forgive me.

LEGISLATOR FORD: Any public
comment? Mr. Budnick. Thank you Chris. And you will get the information about the villages. Thank you.

MR. BUDNICK: I want to strongly support especially the funds that are going to the DWI program. We need to keep in mind that

currently our governor in his current unvoted upon status of his proposed budget anticipates legalizing marijuana, and based upon the experience of Colorado and a number of other states, we can anticipate a large jump in the DWI problem in our county. They may need more resources. And the police may need more resources. And the probation department. And the courts may need more resources. This is a very, very frightening thing that our governor and our current state legislative leadership seem to be, pardon my language, going for. Thank you very much.

LEGISLATOR FORD: Thank you very
much Mr. Budnick. All those in favor of
passing $72-20,73-20$ and $74-20$ please signify by saying aye. Any opposed? The items pass unanimously.

Since there is no other business before us, I will now adjourn the meeting. Moved by Legislator Kopel. Seconded by Legislator Rhoads. All those in favor? The committee is now adjourned.
