LEGISLATOR KOPEL: At this time I
will call the Finance Committee to order. I will act as clerk and $I$ will call the roll.

Mr. Lafazan, Mr. Drucker,
Ms. Birnbaum, Ms. Walker, Mr. McKevitt.
Substituting for Mr. Muscarella is Mr. Ferretti. We have a quorum.

First, I will take a motion to suspend the rules by Mr. McKevitt. Seconded by Mr. Drucker. All those in favor of suspending the rules? Aye. Any opposed?

Now I'm going to call a number of items that have already been through prior committees and we're going to hopefully pass those by consent. Those would be numbers 55, 58, 59, 60, 70, 71. And on the addendum 72, 73, 74. Motion on those by Ms. Walker and seconded by Ms. Birnbaum. All those in favor of those items? Aye. Are there any opposed? So those items are unanimous.

We will go back to item number 40, which is a resolution authorizing a grant agreement with Department of Parks. As well as 41. The first one is with Department of

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Parks and Art Guild of Port Washington. The second one, 41 , is Department of Parks and Oyster Bay Historical Society.

That motion is made by Ms. Walker again and seconded by Mr. Lafazan.

MS. CASO: Tori Caso from the Parks Department.

Item 40 is a grant agreement with the Art Guild of Port Washington for up to $\$ 10,000$ to reopen the Barnett Elder Field's field in order to increase visual arts and cultural programing.

And 41 is the Oyster Bay Historical
Society for up to $\$ 22,000$ to repair and restore the Earl Whiteman Historic House in the Town of Oyster Bay. They are both paid from hotel-motel tax funds.

LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Are there any
legislative questions on those items?
Number 65 is a resolution
authorizing the treasurer to furnish the clerk of the legislature with a petty cash fund in the amount of $\$ 500$.

That motion is made by Mr. Lafazan

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and seconded by Mr. McKevitt.
Michael, what are you going to do with this extravagant amount of money?

MR. PULITZER: We will try to manage that, sir.

LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Anyone have any questions here? Thank you. That was very eloquent.

Number 68 is a supplemental with the Office of Housing and Community Development.

That motion is by Ms. Walker.
Seconded by Mr. Drucker.
MS. PETTIS: Good afternoon. So we are here for 56-20 and 68 I'm sorry.

LEGISLATOR KOPEL: We didn't call
a 56-20 but why don't you wait one moment and
I will do that as well. 56 is a transfer of appropriations for the year 2020. That's a motion by Ms. Birnbaum. Seconded by Mr. Drucker.

MS. PETTIS: Kanecia Pettis,
director of Housing.
MS. SALALA: Loretta Salala,

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fiscal advisor for Housing.
MS. PETTIS: Should I speak on 56 or 68 first?

LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Which would you rather? Go at it please.

MS. PETTIS: Thank you sir. 68. This is our annual contract with New York State who funds our department. Our department is grant funded, 100 percent grant funded, to run the Section 8 program for Nassau County.

LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Okay.
MS. PETTIS: 56 is a transfer of
funds that's already within the same department. But we just want to move funds from one line to the other.

LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Any
legislative questions? So, what we're going to do now I guess is going to vote on the ones I have called. All those in favor of those items? Aye. Any opposed? Those items are all passed unanimously.

I'm going to call 61 and 62 and then I'm going to take a motion for executive

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session on those items. I'm going to call 75 first, which is a transfer of appropriations. That is a motion by Ms. Walker and seconded by Mr. McKevitt.

MS. KELLY: I'm Carolyn Kelly, the deputy medical examiner for laboratories, here on item 75-20. It's a transfer of funds. It's already been approved by the New York State Department of Criminal Justice Services. It's a reallocation of $\$ 13,000$ from the equipment and travel line to personnel salaries. This is needed as a result of the discovery reform legislation.

LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Any
questions? All those in favor of this item? Any opposed?

Mr. Budnick, we are going to go into executive session on two other items, but why don't you do your thing first if you are looking for a chance. Did you have something? Sorry.

Number 61 is a resolution authorizing a settlement in the matter of William T. Joie. And number 62 is a county

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settlement with Adel Marie Dediego. That was a motion by Ms. Walker and seconded by Ms. Birnbaum.

Now I'm going to take a motion for executive session. Made by Mr. McKevitt. Seconded by Mr. Lafazan. All those in favor of executive session? Aye. Any opposed?
(Committee recessed at 3:49 p.m.)
(Committee reconvened at 4:16 p.m.)
LEGISLATOR KOPEL: We are back from executive session. On those two items, Mr. Budnick you wanted to talk about the items that you didn't hear?

MR. BUDNICK: Very quickly. I just wanted the amounts of the two settlements to be spread on the record. Other than that, I stand with your executive session and I will not ask about anything that might have been brought up in executive session except the amounts of the settlements that will be paid for by the county.

LEGISLATOR KOPEL: Right. Thank
you. We discussed that as well and we are satisfied. All those in favor of these two

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items as presented please signify by saying aye. Are there any opposed? Those items pass unanimously.

There is a motion to adjourn made by Ms. Walker and seconded by Mr. Lafazan. All those in favor of adjourning? Aye. All those opposed? We are adjourned. (Committee adjourned at 4:19 p.m.)
