Once 8 established, the integrity monitor will 9 provide reports to the inspector general. 10 Earlier today I spoke to the inspector general 11 regarding this request by the Rules 12 Committee. I don't know if you have any 13 questions. 14 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: Thank you 15 very much. I think that really addresses the 16 concerns that we had. Anyone else want to add 17 anything at this point? Minority Leader. LEGISLATOR ABRAHAMS: 18 T was 19 saying Rich it addresses the Minority's 20 concerns as well. 21 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: 22 Fantastic. We have an email from the 23 comptroller's office. Since under the usual 24 circumstances they would be here to be able to 25 state their position. They've sent us an

It's three 3 paragraphs. 4 Independent integrity monitors have 5 been proven to protect public projects from б cost overruns and ensure compliance policies, 7 procedures and regulations. 8 In order for the county to continue 9 to reform procurement and contracting, it is 10 imperative that companies fully comply with 11 disclosure requirements. 12 The Family and Matrimonial Court 13 Complex project has seen delays and cost 14 In order to move the project overruns. 15 forward, the second phase could benefit from 16 the implementation of a monitorship present. 17 Which obviously we have taken care of. I will present this to Frank. 18 19 LEGISLATOR SOLAGES: Please state 20 for the record I was present during the vote. 21 LEGISLATOR NICOLELLO: In terms 22 of the vote on the phase-in you indicated that 23 you were present but there may have been some 24 technical difficulties, is that what you are 25 telling us? Are you still there?
