Traumatic Incident Stress

The point when demands become extremely threatening, overwhelming, or severe, producing a heightened state of physical, cognitive, behavioral & emotional arousal.



Psychological First Aid: Designed to reduce the initial distress caused by traumatic events and to foster adaptive functioning and coping.

POD Training: Learn how you can help our community when we distribute necessary medications during a public health emergency.

CPR/AED: For either a new certification or refresher.

Non-Violent Crisis Intervention: Equips you with an effective framework to safely manage and prevent difficult behaviors—at work, at home or anywhere.

Stop the Bleed: “A National Call to Action!” Become trained, equipped and empowered to help in a bleeding emergency and save a life.

START Triage: Learn how to access and prioritize casualties, practice using a splint and a sling as well as moving someone on a rescue stretcher.

Fire Suppression: Begins with basic fire safety and behavior techniques in a classroom and then participants use an extinguisher to put out a live fire.

Triage Exercise: Put all your training to work during this realistic staged disaster at the Nassau County Fire Service Academy. Triage “victims”, apply splints and bandages, perform head-to-toe assessments, and move victims.
