

Nassau County Awarded Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting

(MINEOLA, NY) - Elaine Phillips, Nassau County Comptroller, is pleased to announce that the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) has once again awarded Nassau County the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial This award for Nassau's Reporting. Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR) for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2022, is the 39th such consecutive recognition of Nassau's ACFR. The report has been judged by an impartial panel to meet the high standards of the program, which includes demonstrating a constructive "spirit of full disclosure" to clearly communicate the County's financial story.

Ensuring fiscal accountability and transparency in Nassau County government is among the most important functions of the Comptroller's Office and the GFOA Certificate of Achievement is the highest form of recognition in



governmental accounting and financial reporting, and its attainment represents a significant accomplishment by a government and its management.

With a population of almost 1.4 million people and an annual budget of approximately \$4 billion, Nassau County relies on Comptroller Phillips and her dedicated staff to monitor Nassau's budget and financial operations. The Comptroller's Office reports on matters that affect Nassau's financial health, proactively advocates for operational efficiency on behalf of the taxpayers, and audits government departments and outside agencies that do business with the county to uncover and prevent waste, fraud, and inefficiency.

In addition to being responsible for County-wide accounting, the Comptroller's Accounting Division publishes six essential annual reports:

- The Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR)
- The Popular Annual Financial Report (PAFR)
- Single Audit of Federal and State Grants
- Mid-year Report on Nassau County's Financial Condition
- Review of the Proposed Budget and Multi-Year Plan
- The NYS Annual Financial Report (AFR)

The Accounting Division is also leading a multi-year initiative dubbed *NASSAU FORWARD* to replace the County's antiquated financial information system. Through the *NASSAU FORWARD* project, the County will implement a modern integrated Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) financial software system with increased functionality, reporting, automation, and access to real time data.

Each year, the Comptroller's Office reviews thousands of contracts and reviews and approves approximately 100,000 payments to more than 3,800 registered vendors. The Comptroller's office also administers payroll and health benefits for the County's 8,000 employees, 12,000 retirees and their dependents for a total of 50,000 covered lives.
